Commissioning the Music Ministry of Green Spring Presbyterian Church

Music is an integral part of the work of the people of God. God's people have always sung. When the Israelite crossed the Red Sea, Moses and Miriam sang. When Samuel was born, Hannah sang. When the exiles were in Babylon, they wondered whether their song was gone—it wasn't. They still sang. The book of Psalms is an ancient song book. When Gabriel brought good news of great joy to Mary, she sang.

The early church sang hymns, psalms, and spiritual songs, and we have been singing ever since. Today we are commission the music of the church: all that will be sung in the year ahead by all choirs, groups, and the congregation.

To the choir: Do you promise to use your gift of song, of harmony, of weaving together instruments and voices as an offering to God of praise and thanksgiving? **We do, by the grace of God.**

To the Green Spring Men, Green Spring Harmony, and Children's choir: Do you promise to use your musical gifts to share the message of the gospel, to combine voice, instruments, and much joy? **We do, by the grace of God.**

To the congregation: Do you promise to bring your voice to the hymns we sing in the year ahead? Will you sing with honesty in all the seasons of the church year? Will you bring a robust voice to traditional hymns and a commitment to sing a new song to the Lord? **We will by the grace of God.**

Almighty God, You have called us to worship. You have inspired music in the community: words to be written, music to be composed, and people to sing. Stir us to use our talents and voices for your glory. Strengthen our faith through song. Receive, O God, the music and those who make it as a response to your work in Jesus Christ. We pray that the songs we sing carry your message and deepen our faith in Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.
